MR MWAMBU WANENDEYA (-2025)



**Mr Mwambu Wanendeya** worked as Public Affairs Officer in the Communications Division of the Commonwealth Secretariat from 1995 – 2006. During his tenure, he coordinated publicity opportunities with external media for the Secretary-General and other members of senior management.

- I am sorry to inform that ex-ComSec staff member Mwambu Wanendeya passed away a couple of days ago after a long illness. He joined ComSec in 1995 I think and was chiefly responsible for radio, film and broadcasting matters, as well as the dissemination of Commonwealth news and public affairs duties. Mwambu died in his home country, Uganda, and I attach here information on his funeral arrangements. Cheryl Dorall
